Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency's (PHFA) financial assistance program that will be available for homeowners & renters starting on June 29 (this is the date applications will be available – applications can be submitted starting July 6).

- Renters eligible to receive 100% of their monthly rent up to \$750 a month until November 30.
- To be eligible, renters must document at least 30% reduction in annual income since March 1
- Homeowners can receive up to \$1000 a month until November 30.
- Homeowners are eligible if they suffered at least a 30% reduction in annual income due to cut in work hours or wages since March 1.

Housing Assistance for Pennsylvania Renters & Homeowners: to access applications, go to https://www.phfa.org/ starting June 29. Applications can be submitted starting July 6.

Applications for both rent and mortgage assistance will be easily accessible from PHFA's homepage starting June 29. At that time, people will be able to click in a red banner on the website to access the applications and other helpful background information. The red banner is already live on the site advising people of the date applications will be available.

The agency's call center is available weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to assist the public and help with questions about the programs. The toll-free number is 1-855-U-Are-Home (827-3466). Callers should listen for the prompt mentioning CARES assistance for renters and homeowners. The county organizations to which CARES applications are submitted will also have webpages offering useful information.

The CARES funding for renters and homeowners must be completely distributed by Nov. 30, 2020, although it is expected the assistance will be exhausted before the deadline because of the tremendous need by people hurt financially by the pandemic.

Free, remote tax support is available to eligible individuals and families Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evening through June 30. The 2019 tax filing deadline was extended to July 15. To qualify, taxpayers must

- Have made less than \$30,000 as an individual or less than \$55,000 for a family (more than one person) in 2019;
- Have access to and be able to use a smartphone, laptop or computer; and
- Have an email address and phone number.

oranges, blueberries, strawberries, and tomatoes. Each site will be able to serve approximately 300 families on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Low Income Heating & Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

- Pennsylvania has received funds to re-open the LIHEAP program starting **May 18, 2020** running through August 31, 2020 or until funds have been expended
- Will offer a supplemental payment for families that already received a crisis payment during the 2019-2020 season of LIHEAP
- Maximum benefit of \$800 per household
- Pennsylvania residents qualify if one of the following apply:
- o Were notified that their utility service will be shut off in the next 60 days
- o Have had their main or secondary energy source completely shut off
- o Are in danger of being without fuel within the next 15 days or less
- Owe funds to a service provider that would terminate services if not for the Public Utility Commission's temporary moratorium on termination

PA Emergency Assistance Program

- Provides a one-time cash benefit to families who have experienced a significant income reduction or complete job loss due to COVID-19
- Funds will be accepted through June 12, 2020 or until funds are expended

Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT)

- Families whose children qualify for free and reduced-price school meals can receive P-EBT. If a student is already registered for free and reduced school meals or attends a school where all children are eligible for the national school lunch program, no action should be needed.
- Families who receive SNAP and already have an EBT card will receive the funds on their card.
- Families who do not have an EBT card will receive one in the mail

- If a family has experienced job loss or change in income due to the pandemic can still apply for the National School Lunch Program on the COMPASS website and they will receive a pro-rated amount of funds per student in the household: https://www.compass.state.pa.us/compass.web/Public/CMPHome
- If a family has had change of address or must clarify custody arrangements, they should report changes to the school. If you receive benefits through the Department of Human Services, you should report the change to the statewide customer service center as well at 1-877-395-8930.

Food Bank

- Formally announced Doorstep Delivery program, which brings eligible households a 25-pound box of shelf-stable food right to the recipient's door.
- Individuals in need of food assistance should call 412-460-3663 ext. 655 from 8am 4:30pm Monday Friday to find out if they are eligible for the doorstep delivery service

Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) in Pennsylvania:

Pennsylvania's P-EBT will provide households \$370.50 for each child (with some exceptions), which would cover the time schools have been closed due to the pandemic.

SNAP--families are going to receive an extra SNAP payment this month. Families will get another payment this month if they meet the following criteria:

- Received SNAP in March or in the first half of April AND
- Are not already getting the maximum SNAP amount for their household size (i.e. \$509 for a household of 3 people)
- If families already receive maximum monthly benefit for their household size, they will NOT receive another payment

Additionally, PA is working on plans for P-EBT (Pandemic-Electronic Benefit Transfer/Pandemic SNAP), which gives families a benefit equivalent to the value of school meals they would have received while schools are closed. Families with students eligible for free and reduced priced

meals will receive this. More to come on that. Note that this will not replace meals available to families during school closures.

Pharmaceuticals

As a response to COVID-19, Lilly is making all of their **insulin products** available to patients for a \$35 cost, this is for commercially insured patients or uninsured patients. Patients will need to call the Lilly Diabetes Solution Center and a card will be emailed to them within 24 hours (regular mail is also an option). The solution center is also able to connect patients to free insulin that Lilly has donated to non-profits if they meet income criteria – this is an option for Medicare patients. There is also a way to get the free insulin directly through Lilly if there is an urgent need.

Here is a WIC update on their services as of 4/7:

• WIC is continuing to complete appointments for established patients by phone.

- If you have your WIC appointment by phone (established patients), you will most likely be sent a new pre-loaded eWIC card in the mail with the next 3 months-worth of benefits so that you do not need to travel to an office to have your card loaded. Cards will only be sent via mail after the WIC appointment has been completed by phone. There are some situations where patients will not be able to have a card sent by mail and will need to go to a WIC office to have their pre-existing eWIC card loaded. These situations include:
 - o If there is a change in formula
 - o Families who are not new to WIC and already have a WIC enrollee but are adding another enrollee
 - Any family who has active benefits and requires a change in the benefits that they are receiving
- WIC is completing new enrollments. Currently these are by phone but eventually will be
 via a video platform. They are working on getting through the list of pending
 enrollments. Families will have to be patient while they work through applications that
 were received.
 - After completing the intake appointment by phone, all families new to WIC will receive an eWIC card in the mail which is preloaded with 3 months worth of benefits.
 - o All families adding another child who were previously open with WIC will be given a window of time to visit a WIC office to have their card loaded.

Pittsburgh Financial Empowerment Center is Open for Free One-on-One Financial Counseling by Phone or Video

The Pittsburgh Financial Empowerment Center, a joint service of the City of Pittsburgh and Neighborhood Allies operated by Advantage Credit Counseling, is now operating virtually. This free service is available to area residents over age 18 by video and/or phone.

The COVID-19 pandemic has interrupted businesses' and residents' ability to earn and people are making tough decisions about how to use limited resources. The Financial Empowerment

Center provides free counseling to help residents plan during this period of financial uncertainty.

- Neighbors in Need (NIN)—crisis grants to people living in the 15224, 15206, 15201 and 15232 zip codes that have been left jobless by the COVID-19 crisis. The grants typically range from \$150 to \$350, depending on family size and circumstances. The intent is provide funds to help buy food, medicines or toiletries for those in need until the stimulus program kicks into gear. The NIN grants are not for delinquent rent or utility shutoffs.
